



Practicum Judge Guidelines

- Practicum Judge will score the Practicum tests. A practicum judge should have a working knowledge of the CHA Composite Manual and be familiar with the AEL Practicum tests.
- Athletes are encouraged to provide answers from the CHA Manual but as long as their answers are correct they will receive credit. Practicum judges may ask the athletes for further descriptions.
- Practicum judges may ask for a list of answers or may ask for the athletes to identify "hands-on" any Practicum tasks. For athletes with learning differences the Practicum judge will allow written answers or other allowances for these athletes.
- The Practicum judge shall have a master class scoresheet which they will mark the athlete's score.
- They will determine the athlete score by looking at the AEL Practicum tests which the show manager has run off for them, and write that score onto the master class scoresheet. Or, if they prefer, they can just complete each practicum scoresheet and give to scorer

The Practicum judge will provide the scores to the scorers, and also let the announcer know who still needs to take their Practicum so that the Practicum runs in a timely manner.
